Adam Swanson

Join 25-year-old professional pianist Adam Swanson for an exploration of the best contemporary ragtime music composed since the ragtime revival first began in the 1950s. The focus will be new music that still retains an "old-time" sound, but a few vintage favorites will be performed as well. Famed ragtime revivalists such as Max Morath, Johnny Maddox, Ian Whitcomb, and John Arpin have written many fabulous compositions in recent decades that have since taken on a life of their own. Collectively, they have sold millions of records, but seldom is a concert performed that is devoted to new ragtime music.

Adam Swanson is rapidly becoming known as one of the world's foremost performers of vintage American popular music, including ragtime, early jazz, the Great American Songbook, and more. He holds a bachelor's in classical piano and a master's in musicology from the Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University. Although he is only twenty-five years old, Adam has been a featured performer and lecturer at ragtime and jazz festivals across the United States, and he is the only four-time winner of the World Championship Old-Time Piano Playing Contest. In 2007, he appeared alongside the late John Arpin at the Bohem Ragtime and Jazz Festival in the Republic of Hungary and he has also toured Switzerland. Adam made his New York debut in Carnegie Hall at the age of nineteen, where he performed with multi-platinum-selling artist Michael Feinstein. Adam has played at the prestigious Cinecon Classic Film Festival at the Egyptian Theatre in Hollywood and privately for noted Disney/Hollywood composer Richard M. Sherman (*Mary Poppins*, etc.). In 2013, Adam made his first appearance at the Kennedy Center Millennium Stage in Washington, D.C.

Adam Swanson continued.

Adam enjoys working with other musicians and has recorded albums with pianist Frederick Hodges, former rock star Ian Whitcomb, and legendary 1950s recording artist Johnny Maddox, who is one of Adam's greatest influences. Adam's recordings have been used on the CBC TV show *Murdoch Mysteries*. He performs every summer in the Diamond Belle Saloon at the historic Strater Hotel in Durango, Colorado. What is going on? – from Jerry

If you compare the line-up of planned performances found in the last Newsletter to what we list here you will notice things have changed. Originally, Richard Dowling was scheduled to play on January 27th. Several weeks ago, Richard and Bryan Wright received word that the liner notes for Richard's Joplin 3-CD set, that some of you may have in your musical library, had been nominated for a Grammy Award and the Grammy awards night will be January 28th. Richard communicated with us that he would like to go to the Awards Ceremony. Since we had heard Richard only several months ago, realize that a Grammy Awards Ceremony is probably a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity and there would probably be other opportunities to host Richard in the future, we encouraged him to attend. (At that time I did not realize how soon the opportunity to host Richard would surface.) I had been in touch with Adam Swanson for some time, trying to identify when he could play for KCRB. After a few e-mails we set a date of Thursday, February 15 for a concert.

Then, about January 7th, we received a note from the hosts of our annual house concert with Frederick Hodges the second Sunday in June informing us that they now have two Steinway grand pianos among all of those spectacular automated mechanical instruments in the lower level of their home. After a few e-mails, Frederick Hodges and Richard Dowling, who will be in the area after the Joplin Ragtime Festival in Sedalia, agreed to make the June 10th concert a duet concert.

While all of this was going on I was having another e-mail conversation that was an extension of face-to-face talks with Andrew Greene, the conductor of the Peacherine Ragtime Society Orchestra. We have tentatively scheduled a concert with the Peacherine Ragtime Society Orchestra for October 12th. We have the date, but there is still a lot to put in place for this concert. Most of the time we point our visiting musician to a piano and s/he is happy. The Peacherine is a 14 person orchestra. This group does not require a piano. It will need drums, stands, lights, electrical cords and other things that I have yet to learn about.


The new year has really jumped off to an exciting start.
